- ✓ Save our Homes Limitation
- Portability of Save our Homes
- ✓ 10% Limit on Non-Homesteaded



#### Taxable Value of the Home

Assessed Value <u>-Exemptions</u> \* =Taxable Value

\*Exemptions (homestead, senior, widow/widower, military, tangible, etc.)



## **Services Provided**

Emergency Services	<ul> <li>Additional law enforcement beyond base level services. Includes 21 additional deputies, 1 Commander, 3 Sergeants, 2 Corporals and 1 SRD</li> <li>5 fire stations that handle 20-25 calls per day</li> <li>57 full-time firefighters and 50+ volunteers</li> </ul>
Code Enforcement	<ul> <li>Oversees enforcement of City Codes including issues with lawn care, public nuisances, debris, parking, animal control, hazard trees, wildfire mitigation</li> </ul>
Streets	<ul> <li>Approximately 541 miles of public streets</li> <li>Maintain rights-of-way, pavements, medians, sidewalks, signs and traffic signals</li> <li>Picks up litter, mows grass, and maintains landscaping</li> </ul>
Parks	<ul> <li>15 City Parks – including playgrounds, picnic pavilions, athletic fields, and more</li> <li>125 miles of trails and pathways</li> </ul>
