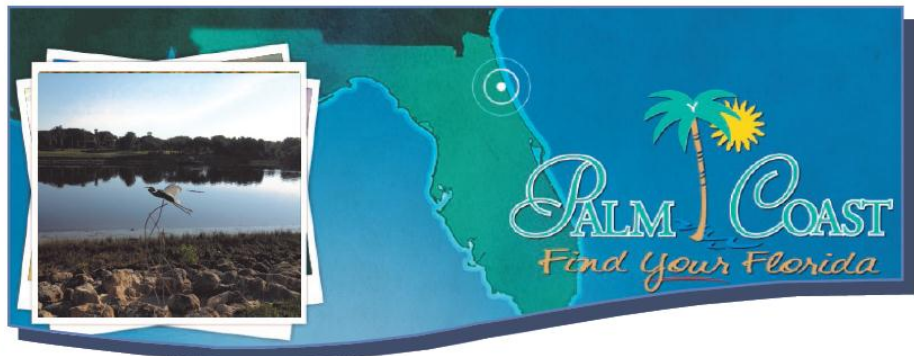

We hear people saying all the time that they would love to volunteer at the Shelter but are afraid that it would be too sad to have close contact with the animals. We understand that sentiment but there are a number of ways you can help that don't involve your interacting with the animals but would help us out so much.

Would you like a few hours a week during which you have some quiet time to read or do crossword puzzles or catch up with Facebook? Maybe you could come and help us with our laundry. We do laundry 8 hours a day, 7 days a week. Our laundry team works in 4-hour shifts and spends the entire time away from the hustle and bustle of the Shelter. You put the laundry in the washer and have about 30 minutes of quiet time to do whatever you want while the wash is being done. Then you put the wash in the dryer and have another 30 minutes to return to your book or tablet or practicing your yoga moves, whatever you want to do. When the dryer stops, you fold the towels and blankets and put them on the shelves. What could be easier? But the value to the Shelter is immeasurable!

Or, you could help out in the Thrift Store, sorting and arranging merchandise, greeting customers, and running the cash register. Our Thrift Store is a major revenue source for us and we are always looking for more volunteers to help. Having additional volunteers gives us the opportunity to be open more days a week or to extend the hours during which we are open. You get to meet a lot of nice people and help the animals. What a deal!

Another option is to join our Events Committee. You can help out with our monthly Yappy Hours--always a great turnout and a great time. Or you could help with some of our bigger events like the upcoming Poker Run. These events bring in much needed funds to the Shelter. They also give us an opportunity to introduce the Shelter to the community.

These are just some of the ways that you can volunteer with FHS and not come in contact with the animals. Of course, if you wanted to see some of the animals, we'd never stop you! ### 3 Sisters (I-1, I-4 & I-6) Water Control Structure Complex 2013 Capital Improvement Project



Start date of 2-18-13 for a 6 month contract time. The construction site is still recovering from the rain event on 5-3-13. Contractor continues to struggle with the inflow of water onto the site. Work continues to progress as well as possible. South structure cap formwork nearing completion. First concrete pour tentatively scheduled for 5/20/13. Project is 75% complete.

- **Stormwater Utility Ordinance** - The City Council has requested that a new method or rate structure be determined for the Stormwater Utility. A rate consultant, PRMG, Inc. was hired to conduct a study. At the 3-12-13 Workshop there was a 2<sup>nd</sup> presentation/discussion of the proposed new rate structure. City Attorney has been requested to prepare a revised rate Resolution which will be presented to Council in an upcoming Workshop on 5-28-13.
- **Stormwater Model and Master Plan (Council's Top Priority Goal)** **(Project is 93% Complete)**  
**Sections 30 and 34:** Consultant prepared first draft of Final Report for City review. Being delivered by 6-21-13.
- **Stormwater Model Improvements for Sections 35 and Section 37 (Survey & Design)** –  
**For Section 35** – Design plans were forwarded to Consultant for model review and application. Trib 35-3 design is continuing. **For Section 37** - Survey for Tributary 2 is complete began working on Trib 3. Complete design projected by 6-28-13. Permitting Services Contract with Consultant for Sections 35 &37 was approved by Council on 5-7-13.

- The average water demand for the week was 7.416 million gallons per day; average wastewater flow was 6.370 million gallons per day.
- Installed 5 new domestic meters, 5 new pep tanks and 9 new reuse meters.
- At present time department has 4 new PEP tanks pending and 11 replacement tanks pending.
- This week 203 utility customers were shut off for non-payment.
- Cleaned and inspected via CCTV 5 service laterals and repaired 3 service laterals.
- Smoke Testing - 1,078 door tags were hung in Section 13 (Brushwood) for upcoming smoke testing that will begin on May 20<sup>th</sup>.
- Staff inspected 3 damaged guardrails from motor vehicle accidents, Palm Harbor Parkway and Forest Grove Drive, Old Kings Road and Forest Grove Drive and Palm Harbor Parkway and Frontier Drive. 2 the 3 repairs have been completed.
- Water Treatment Plant #3 Wellfield Phase 2 Electrical Distribution – The contractor installed the directional drill across the Florida East Coast Railroad right-of-way. The contractor continues to install wiring from the meter cans thru the pull boxes to the power poles at all 12 well sites.
- Beachside Pump Station and Sewer Force Main – The trail west of Colbert Lane to Club House Drive has been open to the public. Due to over 7" of rain the Trail portion east of Colbert Lane to Palm Coast Parkway base material has not dried it has delayed the asphalt application, an alternative of mixing soil cement with the base material to form soil cement and expedite the asphalt completion is underway. Contractor completed installing the main west of the Intracoastal Waterway and is now pressure testing all remaining areas west of the Intracoastal Waterway.
- Staff began mowing in the "R", "L", "P", "Z", "B", "F", "K" sections, Belle Terre Parkway, Easthampton Boulevard, Pine Lakes Parkway, Fuel Depot and Matanzas Woods Parkway.
- Performed site distance trimming in the "F" and "R" sections.
- Cut back 200 linear feet of brush in the ditch on Leidel.
- Streets crew fabricated and repaired the slide at Holland Park to meet standard of height bringing it into compliance.
- Performed sidewalk repair/maintenance on Palm Coast Parkway westbound; replaced approximately 220 linear feet.
- Power washed, removed lettering, painted and reinstalled lettering on 3 blue and white signs neighborhood signs (2 on Commerce and one on Pine Lakes Parkway).
- Graded 6,427 feet of swales, repaired 2 outfalls, cleaned 84 culvert pipes and removed and replaced 2 driveways and culvert pipes.
- Inmates mowed and weeded 46,115 linear feet of ditch in the F section.
