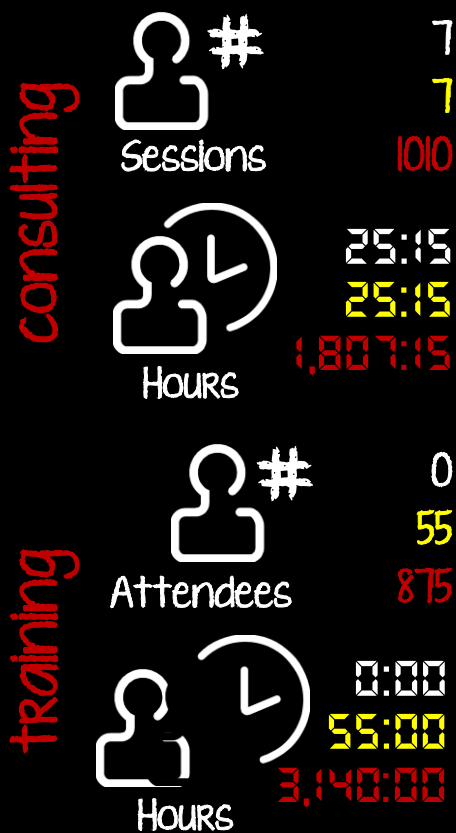

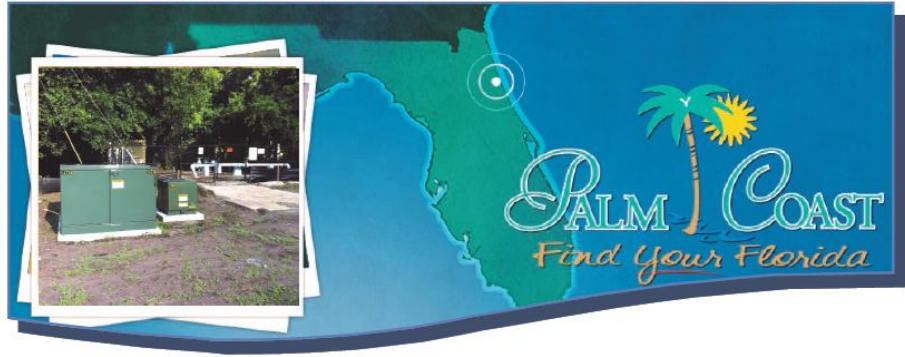

We often get inquiries from clubs, schools, and individuals asking what they can do to help us out other than to give money. Well, there's a lot! Volunteers and foster homes are always needed, of course, but if your time is as tight as your budget, you can still help our homeless animals.

Our business is much like yours in that we have an office to run. Anything you need for your office, we need for ours. That includes paper, file folders, index cards, stamps, envelopes, batteries, pens, staples, paper clips, etc. If you need it in your office, we need it in ours.

We also use a ton of housekeeping supplies. Again, if you need it to keep your house clean, we need it, too. We go through liquid dishwashing soap and powdered laundry soap like crazy. The same is true with bleach and anti-bacterial wipes, hand sanitizer, cleaning powders, like Comet, and glass cleaners. You probably don't need boxes of latex and vinyl gloves but we certainly do. And we can always use brooms, dustpans, towels, wash cloths, and paper towels.

Of course, when you have about 4,000 animals a year come through your doors, animal supplies are in great demand. Our biggest needs are dog and cat food and kitty litter but we also can always use 6-ft leashes, pooper scoopers, and beds for dogs and washable rugs for cats, treats, and toys. Specialty foods are very important and we love to get puppy and kitten food and kitten formula, especially now during kitten season. And don't forget our small mammals. Aspen shavings (not cedar) for bedding, rabbit, guinea pig and bird food are always in short supply.

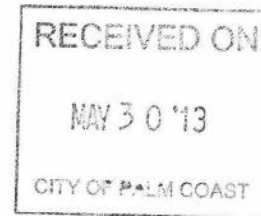

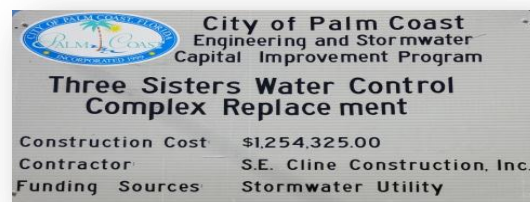

Week In Review May 30 - June 5, 2013

3 Sisters (I-1, I-4 & I-6) Water Control Structure Complex 2013 Capital Improvement Project



Start date of 2-18-13 for a 6 month contract time. All concrete completed for all structure caps. Started preliminary grading and rip rap installation. Working on formwork of the bulkhead caps. Preliminary electrical service and controller installation is underway. Site is experiencing dewatering issues and delays due to recent rain, however production continues. Project is 85% complete

- **Stormwater Utility Ordinance** - The City Council has passed Resolution 2013-49 for a new rate structure for the Stormwater Utility. Presently we are providing input so that the Stormwater fee invoices can be amended to reflect the ordinance changes. A meeting is being scheduled with the Town Center Community Development District (TC CDD) to discuss “reduced – service” Credit amounts.
- **Westchester Lane Drainage Issue** - Soil bores and testing performed on Westchester Ln. for possible vertical drain installation to relieve standing water in swales. Waiting for the final report.
- **Stormwater Model and Master Plan (Council’s Top Priority Goal)** **(Project is 93% Complete)**
Sections 30 and 34: Consultant prepared first draft of Final Report for City review and is being delivered by June 21, 2013.
- **Stormwater Model Improvements for Sections 35 and Section 37 (Survey & Design)** – In-house design is continuing on Section 37 tributaries 1, 2 & 3. Design completion projected by June 28, 2013. The Work Order for Sections 35 & 37 for permitting services was sent to the Consultant on May 17, 2013.

In the past week, the department responded to 146 calls. There were 5 fire related calls, 2 structure fires, 2 wildfires and 1 outside rubbish fire. A total of 99 EMS calls was logged and the balance was miscellaneous in nature. The drought index is at 225 out of a possible 800 and the fire danger is high.

DEPARTMENT / DIVISION SUPPORT

Fire

- GIS Division met with the Fire Department and Utilities/hydrant operators to discuss how migrating hydrant maintenance to InfraMAP would affect the Fire dept. We determined that it would not negatively affect the FD, although the FD would continue to be responsible for private hydrant maintenance records in Fire Programs.

Code Enforcement

- Applications Division assimilated a reconciliatory report for Code that cross references data from Munis and Code Excel spreadsheets for the purpose of a Special Assessments Tax Report that Code creates for non-Ad Valorem taxes. This report shows current total amounts due from each property for various infringements to City code.

Utility

- GIS Division met with our Trimble rep, Ed Sanford. He has allowed us to once again evaluate Trimble's Pro-6H receiver which has newly added functionality to allow collection of points straight through InfraMAP. GIS collected sample GPS points with the Pro-6H, via the InfraMAP interface, to compare to our current GeoXH-2005 units. We will compare the results to determine if the Pro-6H results significantly improve the InfraMAP data collection process.

Community Development

- GIS Division has continued to meet with Community Development to develop the CRS analysis and map to establish our municipal rating.

Finance

- GIS Division provided Finance with a map and count of COPC fire hydrants inside and outside of City limits for budget purposes.

Enterprise

- Applications Division updated the International Food and Wine Festival webpage.
- Applications Division made changes to the AP Invoicing workflow to help Finance staff better manage incoming requests.
- Operations Division received 79 Track ITs this week.
- Operations Division assisted on a Public Request for archived emails.

- Rain Event – Crews made final preparations in case TS Andrea decided to be a significant event in Palm Coast. Delivered 15 yards of sand to Seminole Woos Park for sandbags. Self-service sand stations are now available at Holland Park, Indian Trails Sports Complex, Seminole Woods Park and the Public Works yard. Empty sand bags are available to the public at Fire Stations, City Offices, Utility Office, Public Works and the Community Center. Crews also cleared stormwater inlets and tank trucks were deployed to pump down the wastewater collection system.
- Temporary modification of the disinfection treatment procedure will continue until July 8, 2013.
- The average water demand for the week was 7.302 million gallons per day; average wastewater flow was 5.788 million gallons per day.
- On Tuesday 28 students from FPC High School toured the wastewater treatment plant.
- Installed 5 new domestic meters, 1 new pep tank and 1 reuse meter. At present the utility division has 1 new PEP tank and 17 replacement tanks pending.
- This week 273 utility customers were shut off for non-payment.
- S.E.Cline Construction and utility staff made emergency repairs on an 8” force main at PS 34-1 (Belle Terre at Town Center).
- Water Treatment Plant #3 Wellfield Phase 2 Electrical Distribution – Installation of the main conductor wire on the poles on the north end continues.
- Beachside Pump Station and Sewer Force Main – Contractor continues forming columns and constructing steel for the building walls, they are placing steel and electrical conduits under the floor foundation for the pump station generator building. The contractor continues laying 8” PVC pipe on A1A.
- Staff began mowing in the “Z”, “L”, “C”, “B”, “W” sections, mowing Belle Terre Parkway, Pine Lakes Parkway, Palm Harbor Parkway, Matanzas Woods Parkway and Palm Coast Parkway.
- Performed site distance trimming in the “L” and “W” sections.
- Performed sidewalk repair/maintenance on Palm Coast Parkway replacing 220 linear feet.
- Blue and White City Sign Maintenance continues on Belle Terre Parkway, Whiteview Parkway, Royal Palms Parkway and US1.
- Graded 6,688 feet of swales, repaired 5 outfalls and cleaned 76 culvert pipes.
