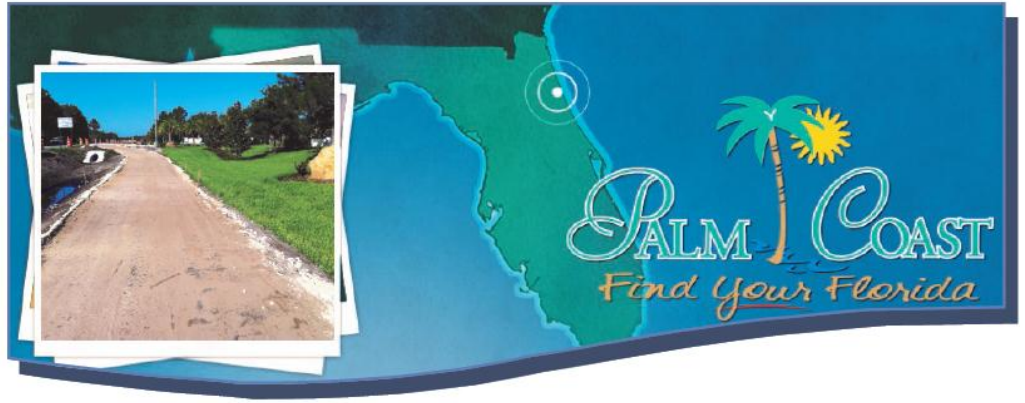

**PLANNING**

- City staff coordinated a meeting of the Citizens’ Advisory Task Force (CATF) for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. The CATF is an advisory board to the City Council on matters related to the CDBG program. Agenda items for the meeting, which will eventually be presented to the City Council, include amendments to the 5-year Consolidated Action Plan, to include public service as a CDBG activity, amendments to the FFY 2012 CDBG Action Plan to move funding between different activities in the Action Plan, and review of the proposed FFY 2013 Annual Action Plan. The Annual Action Plan is the document that outlines how the City intends to utilize the CDBG funds for the coming fiscal year.

**Transportation:**

- City staff held a meeting with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and Volusia Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) to further discuss the reapportionment process. FDOT previously received a list of questions the City prepared regarding funding and prioritization of City transportation projects in the future as part of a TPO. FDOT continues to work on a response and a follow-up meeting will be scheduled once a draft response is prepared.
- City staff attended the Transportation Planning Organization Board meeting. The TPO Board approved the Reapportionment Subcommittees recommendation to change the TPO Board meeting day and time to the fourth Wednesday of each month at 9:00 AM (effective in August). This request was facilitated by Palm Coast to provide a day and time that would not conflict with City Council meetings and workshops. The TPO Board action was a positive step forward in providing Palm Coast a seat at the table. In addition, the TPO Board also changed the Name of the organization from the “Volusia TPO” to “River to Sea TPO”. The City will continue to work with the TPO Board and its subcommittees during this transition period of becoming part of the new TPO.
- Staff from the City of Palm Coast, Bunnell, and Flagler County met to discuss the FDOT Work Program Priority List. The current recommendation for the 5-year program, will have Old Kings Road Extension (from Forest Grove Dr. to Matanzas Woods Parkway), and Old Kings Road 4-laning (Palm Coast Parkway to Forest Grove Dr.) as priorities #1 and #2, respectively.

### **Trap/Neuter/Return (TNR)**

More and more communities around the country are changing the way that they deal with community cats. Community cats are those that live outside and don't really belong to anyone in particular. They may be feral (cats that have never been socialized) or abandoned, or lost, or just left to wander outside. Regardless, the numbers of these community cats continues to grow and grow. In Florida and other southern states, the situation is compounded by the fact that our warm climate encourages unsterilized cats to produce 3 and even 4 litters a year.

In the past, communities have relied on outside cats being trapped by animal control and brought into shelters where they are routinely euthanized. These cats are euthanized because they are largely unsocialized and cannot be adopted out. This trap and euthanize process is terribly costly because it takes money to hire the animal control officers, transport the cats to a shelter and then pay the intake/euthanasia fees. In addition, it is inherently inhumane to kill animals simply because they exist. The largest number of animals killed in shelters across the country is cats. Most residents don't realize the expenses borne by taxpayers to essentially trap and kill cats.

The biggest problem, however, with the trap and kill methods of controlling animal populations is that it just doesn't work. Cats will and are reproducing far faster than they can be trapped so the population continues to grow. I've even heard one authority in this field estimate that it would take every animal control officer in Florida 11 years working 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to trap the community cats in our state and that assumes that the cats do not reproduce at all during that period. In other words, it's just plain impossible.

At FHS we are exploring ways to bring TNR to Flagler County. Other nearby municipalities are moving to TNR and finding great success. There are groups of residents at work right now to take the lead in this arena and you will see petitions all over to show government officials that there is public support for TNR.

We offer residents our Community Cat program to help in this fight. If someone brings us an unowned cat, we will spay/neuter it, vaccinate it against rabies, and tip its ear (the universal sign of a fixed community cat) for \$25. All we ask is that the animal is brought in to us by 8:30 in the morning and that they come back that same afternoon to pick them up. For females, we may advise that the animal be kept inside overnight to be sure that it has time to fully recover from its surgery and has no post-surgical problems.

If you have a community cat (or two or more) that you would like to have us fix, call the Shelter at 386-445-1814 and ask about our Community Cat certificate program.

### **Special Announcements**

Our monthly Vaccine and Microchip Clinic will be held at the Shelter (1 Shelter Drive, Palm Coast) from 1 to 3 on Saturday, July 6. No appointment is necessary but dogs do have to be on a leash and cats contained in carriers. 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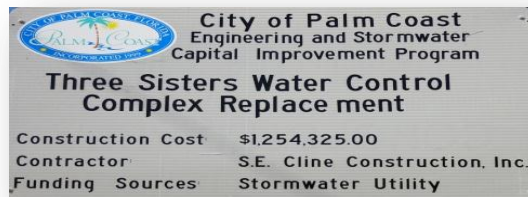

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### 3 Sisters (I-1, I-4 & I-6) Water Control Structure Complex 2013 Capital Improvement Project



Start date of 2-18-13 for a 6 month contract time. Project is 92% complete.

Started removal of dewatering sheet piles. Working on final excavation of the center basin and rough grade of embankments. Electronics installation substantially complete.

- **Stormwater Utility Ordinance** - The City Council has passed Resolution 2013-49 for a new rate structure for the Stormwater Utility. Presently we are providing input so that the Stormwater fee invoices can be amended to reflect the ordinance changes. Staff has begun re-calculating vacant parcels which apply to the 95% reduced service credit.
- **Street Light Inventory Review** – Annually staff reviews and verifies the street light inventory for accuracy and actual verification of light location for quality control. The S,U,K,LL,Z,E,P,R sections are complete. Began in the W section which is 20% complete.
- **Stormwater Model and Master Plan (Council’s Top Priority Goal)** **(Project is 95% Complete)**  
**Sections 30 and 34:** Consultant prepared first draft of Final Report for City review and is being delivered by July 8, 2013.
- **Stormwater Model Improvements for Sections 35 and Section 37 (Survey & Design)** – In-house design is continuing on Section 37 tributaries 1, 2 & 3. Section 37 Tribs. 1, 2 & 3 – soft digs are completed. In house design completion projected by mid-July. The consultant is working on the permitting for the St. Johns River Water Management Dist. permit for Sections 35 & 37. Staff is meeting with our Utility Dept. on 7-11-13 to discuss coordination of any possible crossing conflicts.



### **Total Aquatic Weed Control on Freshwater Canals**

Aquatic Management Plus, LLC continues herbicide spraying on the canals.

**A new aquatic weed in the Palm Coast canals.** The University of Florida Ag Extension office has tentatively identified it to be Azolla Pinnata (sample picture insert above). This weed is new to the region. So far it has only been reported in Jupiter, Florida and only came to Palm Coast this year. Other strains of Azolla live in our canals and respond well to herbicide treatment. All standard treatments of this strain have been unsuccessful at eradication. Azolla Pinnata is on the National Noxious Weed list. A sample has been sent to the University of Florida for positive identification and treatment options. The weed grows in mats of small plants that rapidly grow. One of the most common spreading methods is through animals carrying it from waterway to waterway. Presently it has appeared in the P, R and S sections. Still waiting to hear back from the University of Florida.

- Operations Division worked on the repair of equipment at various City sites due to lightning strikes during last week's electrical storms. Issues at Public Works, Holland Park, Indian Trails Sports Complex, and the Fuel Depot have all been repaired.

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- Temporary modification of the disinfection procedure will continue until July 8, 2013. Customers may notice an increase in the taste and odor of chlorine in the drinking water during this process.
- The average water demand for the week was 7.243 million gallons per day; average wastewater flow was 5.630million gallons per day.
- Installed 6 new domestic meters, 1 reuse meters and 1 new pep tank. Also replaced 2 existing PEP tanks.
- This week 213 utility customers were shut off for non-payment.
- Water Treatment Plant #3 Wellfied Phase 2 Electrical Distribution – The contractor has installed all transformers. A substantial completion was performed. Contractor is working on punch list.
- Beachside Pump Station and Sewer Force Main – The entire sidewalk west of the Intracoastal is opened to the public. The contractor has started placing the split face block for the pump station generator building. The contractor has installed 95% of 8” PVC pipe and meter assembly on A1A at the south end of the project. Sodding and dress-up work on the west side of the intra-coastal is roughly 85% complete..
- Staff began mowing in the “Z”, “R”, “P”, “B”, “C” and “S” sections, mowing Belle Terre Parkway, Royal Palms Parkway, Palm Harbor Parkway, Pine Lakes Parkway, Easthampton Boulevard, Matanzas Woods Parkway and Palm Coast Parkway.
- Performed site distance trimming in the “L” section.
- Graded 5,725 feet of swales, repaired 3 outfalls, cleaned 44 culvert pipes, installed pipe to replace 1 driveway culvert and apron. Staff installed 2 valley cutters at Pinelark Lane and Pratt Place.
- Ditch crew sprayed 18 acres of ditch in the “R” section.
- PW and Summerville replaced 18 traffic signal LED’s overhead that where failing and did not meet the standard.
- Replaced approximately 80 linear feet of sidewalk maintenance\repair on Boulder Rock Drive.
- Installed 3 stones at The Children’s Memorial Garden for Recreation Department.
- Crews trenched and installed PVC for new well at Fire Station #21.
- This week crews installed a 16” x 4” wet tapping sleeve and 4” valve on the reuse main on Town Center Blvd. After wet tapping the main they installed 4” reuse piping, mechanical joint fittings, a 4” meter and connected the line to a 4” HDPE line which was bored the day before.
- Wastewater staff completed one hour training course on “How to Prevent and Identify Heat Stress”.
- Inmates mowed and weeded 46,438 linear feet of ditch in “R” section.

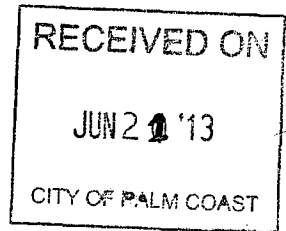

### **Soccer tournament with international teams coming to Palm Coast sports complex**

**Palm Coast, Fla.** – Youth soccer teams from England and across the United States will come to Palm Coast in October for a major youth soccer tournament being put on by Global Image Sports (GIS), in association with the local PDA Florida competitive soccer club.

The GIS Cup soccer tournament will be held at Indian Trails Sports Complex over Columbus Day weekend, Oct. 11-13. GIS is a Georgia-based sports management company that represents European professional soccer clubs searching for new soccer talent in North America.

West Ham United of England's Premier League will be sending a U16 (under age 16) Academy Team to compete in the Elite Showcase Bracket at the GIS Cup. The tournament is expected to attract many teams from outside the region due to GIS partnerships across the United States, GIS officials said. Participation is open to youth teams from U9 to U18.

"We are very excited about the first GIS Cup soccer tournament at this excellent location in Palm Coast," said Mike Kelleher of GIS. "We have been actively seeking the right facility and partner for the past few years to launch our tournament series, and in Palm Coast and PDA Florida we believe we have the perfect fit!"

Tournament Director Reggy Monsanto of PDA Florida said this will be the first tournament ever to bring international teams to play in Palm Coast. "GIS has partner clubs all over the United States, and all of them are being invited," Monsanto said. "Once word gets out, we think more teams from around the region will come. Higher-level teams are looking for opportunities to compete against like competition and against teams they've never played before, and the GIS Cup will be a perfect fit for both."

The City has worked strategically over the past three years to develop Palm Coast as a premiere location for youth soccer and lacrosse in the Southeast. Partners in the economic development initiative include the Flagler County Tourist Development Council, the Palm Coast Sports Alliance and PDA Florida.

The GIS Cup soccer tournament is the latest in a series of big sports announcements for Palm Coast and those partners. The area's popularity for soccer and lacrosse tournaments has grown steadily in recent years, aided by top-notch field conditions, beautiful weather, excellent quality of life, and its central location mid-way between Orlando and Jacksonville with easy access to Interstate 95.

Last month, the City leased 65 acres to PDA Florida for development of a new soccer complex on U.S. 1 that has the potential to attract larger and more prestigious soccer tournaments. In March, Just4Keepers International Goalkeeping Academy, an international youth soccer program that prepares goalkeepers for college and professional soccer, selected Palm Coast as the home for its new U.S. national camp. Just4Keepers' regional camp this month featured legendary goalkeeping coach Jim Leighton of Scotland; the academy's national residential camp will be held in Palm Coast later this year.

In partnership with FC United (now PDA Florida), the City hosted the Olympic Development Program in January and the Florida Youth Soccer Association's State Cup Round of 16 for four age levels in April. With a grant from the TDC and cooperation from Flagler Schools, the City doubled the size of its Indian Trails Sports Complex in 2011 by adding four fields at adjacent Indian Trails Middle School.

"Attracting sports training and tournaments to Palm Coast is a key initiative in the City's economic development strategy, and we're very excited to welcome the GIS Cup to Palm Coast this fall," said Mayor Jon Netts. "Tournaments such as this bring business to our hotels, restaurants and stores, and we hope that some of our visitors will want to visit again or move here with their businesses once they see that Palm Coast is a special place."
