

- Re: Week in Review
 - The average water demand for the week was 6.653 million gallons per day; average wastewater flow was 6.063 million gallons per day.
 - Installed 6 new domestic meters and 2 new PEP tanks. Also set up dewatering systems for a PEP tank replacement.
 - This week 48 utility customers were shut off for non-payment.
 - Relocation of palm trees to the Indian Trails Sports Complex from Palm Coast Parkway is 100% complete including irrigation, mulching and placing of coquina stones between trees.
 - A project was started this week to re-align the drainage ditch at 324 Beachway Drive. The existing ditch is wider than necessary and posed potential future issues with a house foundation if left alone.



- Work began on the Palm Coast Parkway west median improvement project. An herbicide has been applied to kill off existing grass and weeds. Tree removal to begin soon.
- Zero Liquid Discharge Water Treatment Plant #2 The contractor is excavating the new retention pond and hauling excavated material off site. The electrician continues installing conduit on site. The foundations for clarifier #1, #2 and the lime sludge thickening tank have been poured. Installation of rebar in the EQ tank along with the water seal continues.
- Beachside Pump Station and Sewer Force Main The painting of the pump station building is near completion, Florida Power and Light meter has been installed, and the water service has been connected to the pump station building. The diesel fuel con-vault tank for the pump station generator has been set on the concrete slab.
- Mowing in "S", "K", "B", "R", "P", and "E" sections. Mowing Belle Terre Parkway, White View Parkway, Pine Lakes Parkway, Matanzas Woods Parkway, Palm Harbor Parkway, and Palm Coast Parkway.
- Performed site distance trimming in the "L" and "F" sections.
- Graded 7,305 feet of swales, repaired 1 outfall, and cleaned 92 culvert pipes.
- Ditch crew sprayed 7.5 acres of ditch in the "E' section and Palm Coast Parkway.
- Installed 2 new bike service stations, one at Linear Park and one at the Power Lines near Fire Station 25.
- Staffed two separate Special Events, "Pumpkin Shootout" at Indian Trails Sports Complex and "Cause for Paws" at Town Center.
- Inmate labor crew mowed and weeded 47,863 linear feet of ditch in the "B" and "L" sections.
