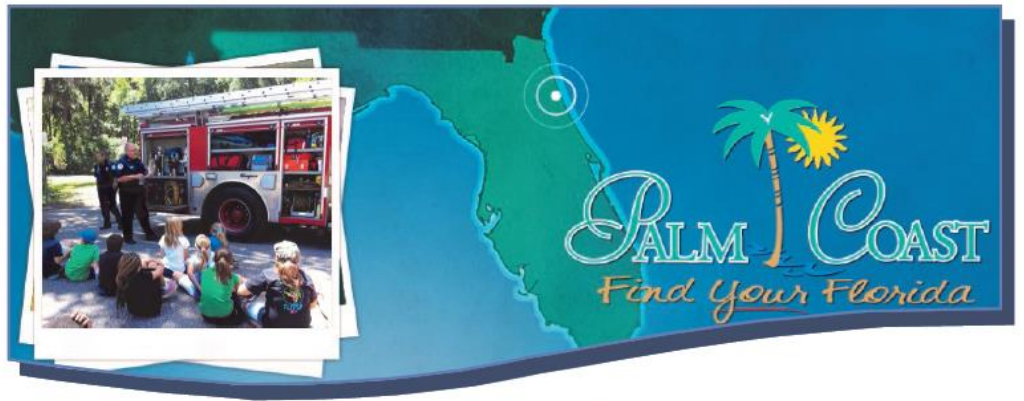

Green Team

- The Adopt-a-Trail program is alive and well in the City, as we have received and approved the applications of two more trail adoptions. The first trail is on Palm Harbor Parkway and begins just north of the bridge by the Palm Coast Marina and extends northward to Cottonwood Court. This trail was improved with benches, trash receptacles, and landscaping by the benches last year. The adoptive parents are Sylvia Danese and Elijah Moore.

The second adoption is along the new trail that was paved along Pine Lakes Parkway beginning at Palm Coast Parkway and going north to Pine Lakes Parkway. This trail was recently completed last fall and also includes our trail benches, trash receptacles and landscaping. This trail was adopted by Gary and Gail Anderson.

- The Rotary Club of Flagler County is known for its contribution to education in our County, but they felt they needed to do even more for our elementary school students to broaden their education. A suggestion was made to the Club that the City was lacking funding to help them conduct one more CHIRP program this school year and that maybe they could help. A presentation was made to the Rotary Club by the City explaining to them what CHIRP was all about, and the Club voted to approve \$700 for bussing the students to the park. The Club's Charitable Giving Committee felt that this program was just what they were looking for to help expand the learning experience for as many as 250 students over a two-day event. The six programs offered over those two days helped the City get closer to achieving one of their State acquisition grant requirement goals to provide a minimum of 24 educational programs a year at Linear Park.
- On May 15th and 16th, Bunnell Elementary 5th Grade students participated in Linear Park Eco-Station Rotation partially funded by Rotary Club of Flagler County. The program consisted of three stations: Disaster Preparedness presented by Palm Coast Fire Station 22, Linear Park Eco-systems presented by the Green Team and City volunteer Mike Kuypers and Animal Education and Rescue presented by Wildlife Tree Discovery and Wild About Birds. Students were lead on a 1.5 mile tour of the park stopping for the 30 minute presentation along the route. Following the program students enjoyed lunch and exploring the park.

Week In Review May 15, 2014 – May 21, 2014

- **M-3 Water Control Structure Rehabilitation Project for 2014 – Project is 99.9% Complete**

Contract award to S.E. Cline Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$439,325. Substantial completion inspection conducted. Gate is operational, with minor bugs to be corrected by the actuator company. Water level transducer in place and operating. **Project was completed on time and within budget.**



- **Stormwater Model Construction Improvements for Sections 35 and Section 37**
Section 35 is complete. This portion of the project will increase the capacity of the drainage system and replace deteriorated drainage pipes. Section 37 portion of the project has been put on hold, pending determination of prioritizing projects.



Before

- **Stormwater Model Improvements Land Acquisition** - The Contract Agreement is under negotiations with the owner. The land appraisals are completed.
- **National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit** – The City has received notification from the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) that we must obtain a NPDES permit and develop and implement a stormwater management program to minimize the discharge of pollutants through and from waters of the United States. We must submit our Notice of Intent (NOI) and permit fee by 6-1-2014. Staff prepared the NOI for City Manager’s review by 5-28-14.

- **Colechester @ College Waterway Bridge #63 Rehab Design** - Design is underway with 60% plans due in June.
- **Additional Fields at Indian Trails Middle School** - Assignment letter received from Flagler School Board on 3-21-14, permit application submitted to SJRWMD on 3-22-14.
- **Major Drainage Pipe F-2 @ Boulder Rock Drive** – Staff prepared a scope of services needed for professional outside survey services, price proposals are due 5-23-14. Permitting and design will be done “in house”.
- **Long Creek Blueway** - Awaiting grant presentation to Florida Inland Navigational District.
