Waste Water Treatment Plant #2, Groundbreaking


The Palm Coast City Council broke ground Tuesday, on the City's new Wastewater Treatment Plant 2. This new plant will incorporate the latest technology and will be an Advanced Wastewater Treatment (AWT) facility, producing an effluent quality that nearly meets drinking water quality standards. It will add 2 million gallons per day of additional wastewater capacity that will be needed to accommodate anticipated growth in the community.

Parks & Medians Maintenance

- Inspected 40,365 linear feet of park hiking trails and 235 signs.
- Inspected 43 irrigation zones, cleaned, replaced, adjusted spray heads, and repaired line breaks, along City medians.
- Painted two fields for Beaches Adult Soccer League and six fields for REC soccer at Ralph Carter Park.
- Painted four soccer fields for PDA at Indian Trails Sports Complex.
- Painted two football fields at Belle Terre Park.
- Performed edging, grading and relining of the baseball fields at Indian Trials Sports Complex.
- Maintained, weeded, and trimmed back all beds at Fire Station 24.
- Inspected 23 irrigation zones, cleaned, replaced, and adjusted spray heads in City parks.
- Performed safety inspections on playground equipment, parks, and trails at 22 locations.
- All mulched playgrounds (6) were leveled.
- Maintained, fertilized and mulched all center medians on Belle Terre Parkway, Palm Coast Parkway, SR-100, and Old Kings Road.
- All City parks (12) were moved and maintained.
- Grounds were maintained at 250 well sites and lift stations.



This could potentially be harmful to your pet if they encounter one. Florida is home to at least 6 different species of venomous snakes and up to 50 other species of snakes that can still bite. If your pet were to be bitten by a snake, seek veterinary attention immediately. Your pet's life could depend on it. There are anti-venoms available but need to be administered within minutes to hours of infection.





Re: Week in Review

- Once again, the Palm Coast Water Buoys took first place at the state competition for the Top Ops Challenge. Now on to Nationals in June.
- The average water demand for the week was 7.848 million gallons per day; the average wastewater flow was 5.576 million gallons per day.
- Crews installed 15 new domestic water meters and 7 new PEP tanks and replaced 1 tank.
- There were a total of 45 calls after hours.
- This week there were 111 disconnects for nonpayment.
- Wastewater completed smoke testing 10,035 feet of gravity sewer in Section 16 (Colechester) and replaced 16 cleanout caps.





- Wastewater installed new control panel and conduit at pump station 12-1 (Barrington). Installed a new rack and control panel at pump station BB-26 (Forest Hill).
- The contractor completed the new landscaping and irrigation at pump station. 59-1 (Sea Trail).
- A few employees attended the Florida Water Resource Conference Annual Convention and EXPO in Orlando. Pat Henderson was recognized as joining the Quarter Century Operators Club by WEF (Water Environment Federation). Pat has been at the Palm Coast Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP) for over 25 years. The plant was also recognized (officially) for the outstanding safety program and received an award from the FWEA (Florida Water Environment Association).
- Wastewater Maintenance completed 24 pep maintenance and 103 service orders. Replaced 24 pep pumps and 21 floats.
- Water Distribution crews replaced 15 water services lines (retrofit), repaired 5 service lines and tested and repaired 24 backflow preventers.
- Brian Matthews and Cynthia Schweers gave a presentation to the Flagler County Realtors Association. The presentation's focus was on water conservation and included information about Water Star, reuse and the National Mayor's Challenge for water conservation.

City of Palm Coast Utility team wins 10th Top Ops State Championship

Palm Coast – The Palm Coast Utility Department's "Water Buoys" team won its 10th Top Ops State Championship on April 26, successfully challenging water treatment teams from other Florida entities in a fast-paced question/answer competition.

Team members Fred Greiner (captain), Tom Martens, Peter Roussell and Jim Hogan (coach) correctly answered more questions than any other team competing at the annual Florida Water Resource Conference (FWRC) in Orlando. FWRC is a joint conference of the American Water Works Association, The Florida Water Environment Association (FWEA), and the Florida Water and Pollution Control Operators Association (FWPCOA).

Questions in this competition covered a broad range of operational topics including basic science, chemistry, hydrology, water distribution, public health and sanitation, plant maintenance, safety and process control. The annual contest recognizes and promotes excellence in all aspects of water operations, giving operators the opportunity to showcase their knowledge and talents. The Palm Coast team has won the state championship for 10 of the past 12 years.

"The Top Ops team is excited to again bring home the win, and we're looking forward to advancing to the national competition," said Hogan, Palm Coast Utility Systems Manager of Water Operation. "The team's dedication and competitive drive to excel in this fast-paced contest, involving all technical aspects of water treatment, ultimately benefits the citizens of Palm Coast by having a better, more-motivated and highly trained operating staff for the City's water treatment plants."

The City's state-champion Top Ops Team will compete for the top national honors at the American Water Works Association Annual Conference and Exposition (ACE) to be held in Chicago in June. Since 2005, the Water Buoys have won the national competition five times – including in 2014. The team placed second in the nation in 2015.

The Florida Section of the AWWA awards expense-paid trips to the winners of the state competition, so no City funds will be used toward the national competition. Team members pay for the competition out of their own pockets and then receive financial reimbursement from the Florida Section.

The opportunity to attend the conference, and even practice for the competition, has a major pay-off for the Palm Coast community, Hogan said.

"The educational aspects of Top Ops cannot be understated," Hogan said. "The Water Buoys study relevant technical manuals and practice for the competition all year long. The team members then impart their knowledge to the operational staff in regularly scheduled, in-house training sessions."


