

McDonalds Restaurant Issued a Development Order on September 27, 2016

The existing McDonalds restaurant located at 6030 East Highway 100 has completed a TIER I Technical Site Plan review to modify the existing single lane drive-thru to allow side-by-side ordering points. The original McDonalds site plan was approved by Flagler County and constructed prior to the City of Palm Coast being incorporated. The proposed improvements will help eliminate existing queuing (car circulation) problems on-site. The project also includes exterior façade upgrades and ADA and sidewalk improvements.

Many "trainers" are not licensed and are just individuals who know about dog training techniques. It is very important to choose someone who has had some training in how to appropriately evaluate your pet and their behavior issue. They should be trained in animal behavior and not just training methods. Make sure to use a behaviorist that enforces "positive reinforcement". This method is more humane and your pet is more willing to accept it. For more information, you may always contact FHS for a behaviorist referral.

In the past week, the department responded to a total of 172 calls. There was one fire call. We responded to a cooking fire. A total of 106 EMS calls were logged and the balance was miscellaneous in nature. The drought index is at 194 out of a possible 800 and the fire danger is low.

Our CAD, Computer Aided Dispatch, was upgraded this week. As with any upgrade, there are a few glitches that are currently being worked out. A special thanks goes to Steve and Mirna in IT and Leo in the FD for upgrading all Fire Department computers starting at 4am and ending at 9pm. We truly appreciate all that you do!

Chief Beadle presented the apparatus replacement schedule requesting one commercial pumper this week. The current update on the twin engines is that one is in FL and the other one will be on the way soon!

We attended the Zika briefing by the Health Department.

Employee Academy was held at the Fire Department on Thursday. Employees arrived in time for lunch and enjoyed a meal with Chief Beadle. We thank the Fire Department Volunteers for their assistance!

We held a Basic Life Support class for Healthcare Providers this week. This course is designed to give healthcare professionals the ability to recognize several life-threatening emergencies, provide CPR, use an AED, and relieve choking in a safe, effective, and timely manner.

For the next three weeks the FZ pool will be accommodating the Flagler County STEM Academy. They are scheduled for Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. We have 22 kids plus one teacher. Majority of the students are from Wadsworth Elementary. The following dates will be September 27th-September 29th; October 3rd-October 7th; and October 10th- October 12th.

Staff have been teaching students Water Safety, Learning to swim, and Lifeguarding Skills. We will continue over the next 3 weeks in improving their swimming skills. It is our goal for Schools to use the pool as one of their PE classes in the future and this small program is a great stepping stone towards our goal.



The City of Palm Coast Fire Department offers CPR and First Aid Training

- 1. The Healthcare Provider course -- a professional certification course -- includes a multiplechoice written exam and a practical exam.
- 2. Workbooks for use during the class are provided. It is highly recommend that participants purchase a course workbook. The American Heart Association recommends that each student review the course information for two weeks prior to the course. Workbooks can be found at : http://www.aha.channing-bete.com/
- 3. Course available to those ages 13 and up.
- 4. All courses begin at 9:00 a.m. Participants should arrive a few minutes ahead of time for check-in.
- 5. A minimum of six persons is required for each course date. If fewer than six persons have registered, each person will be contacted to reschedule or to receive a refund.
- 6. Please contact CPRcertification@palmcoastgov.com with any questions.

First Aid and CPR/AED

Heartsaver First Aid is a 7-hour classroom course *(includes 1 hour for lunch)* that is designed to meet OSHA regulations. The course teaches basic first aid skills:

- Administering CPR to an infant, young child, or an adult.

Re: Week in Review

- The use of free chlorine as the primary disinfection treatment procedure continues this week. During this time customers may notice an increase in the taste and odor of chlorine in their drinking water.
- The average water demand for this week was 8.093 million gallons per day. The average wastewater flow was 5.768 million gallons per day.
- Crews installed 17 new domestic water meters, 3 reuse meters and 3 new PEP tanks.
- There were a total of 44 calls after hours.
- This week there were 82 disconnects for non-payment.
- Staff performed smoke testing at Flagler County Airport, and found two open 6" clean outs.
- Water Distribution crews repaired 1 service line, 15 meter pit/manifolds, and tested/repaired 82 backflow preventers.
- Wastewater crews inspected via CCTV, 9,360 feet of gravity sewer and inspected 47 manholes. They also replaced 26 pep pumps, 37 floats and 10 cleanout caps.
- Water Distribution crews completed Phase 2 of the Shoppes of Palm Harbor meter/backflow/piping replacement and have now started Phase 3.

Palm Coast City Hall awarded prestigious LEED Green Building Certification

Palm Coast, Florida – Palm Coast City Hall has been awarded LEED certification at the Silver level for design and construction that demonstrates high performance in sustainable site development, water savings, energy efficiency, materials selection and indoor environmental quality.

The LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) rating system, developed by the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC), is the foremost program for buildings, homes and communities that are designed, constructed, maintained and operated for improved environmental and human health performance.

"The City is committed to strong environmental practices and programs, and we worked very hard to make our new City Hall resource-efficient and innovative in nature," said City Administration Coordinator Denise Bevan. "So we are incredibly proud to receive the news that our new facility has been LEED certified at the Silver level!"

The Palm Coast City Council has for many years championed conservation and environmental stewardship, encouraging the Palm Coast community to care for land, water, air and wildlife. The City earned Florida Green Building Coalition's "Green Local Government" designation in 2009 and, last year, was recertified at the Gold Level. That voluntary program laid the foundation for the City's goal to earn LEED certification for the new City Hall, which opened in October 2015. The two-story, 41,309-square-foot building is located at 160 Lake Ave., adjacent to Central Park in Town Center.

City Hall achieved LEED certification at the Silver level for implementing practical and measurable strategies and solutions in numerous LEED categories. Based on the number of points achieved, each project receives one of four LEED rating levels: Certified, Silver, Gold and Platinum.

The environmentally friendly features at Palm Coast City Hall include LED lighting throughout, insulated and tinted windows, a highly efficient HVAC chiller system, drought-tolerant landscaping, low-flow plumbing fixtures, a roof that prevents solar heat gain on the roof, occupancy sensors to automatically control lighting, use of building materials with better indoor air quality attributes, and preferred parking for energy-efficient vehicles.

More than 33,500 commercial projects have been certified, comprising more than 5 billion certified commercial square feet in all 50 states and more than 161 countries and territories. Of those, some 2,400 projects were completed by local governments.

"Buildings are a prime example of how human systems integrate with natural systems," said Rick Fedrizzi, CEO and founding chair, USGBC. "The Palm Coast City Hall project efficiently uses our natural resources and makes an immediate, positive impact on our planet, which will tremendously benefit future generations to come."

Highlights of the design and construction for which Palm Coast City Hall earned LEED certification points are broken down in the following LEED categories:

Sustainable Sites – site selection, bicycle storage, parking for energy-efficient vehicles, maximizing open space, stormwater design, roof design

Water Efficiency – landscaping, water-use reduction

Energy & Atmosphere – optimized energy performance, enhanced refrigerant management, green power

Materials & Resources – construction waste management, recycled content, use of regional materials, certified wood

Indoor Environmental Quality – outdoor air delivery monitoring, thermal comfort, lowemitting paints/coating/adhesives/sealants/flooring, indoor chemical and pollutant source control, controllability of lighting systems

Innovation in Design – reduced mercury in lamps, Green Building education, LEED Accredited Professional
