Hurricane Matthew Cleanup Continues

City crews, and our contractor, continued the cleanup in the aftermath of Hurricane Matthew. To date, debris removal is measured at 119,816 cubic yards or 3,562 dump truck loads. The first

round of debris cleanup was completed Sunday, November 6th, the second round was completed on Thursday, November 17th, and the final round of debris cleanup is expected by the end of the week. We'd like to extend our appreciation and thanks to the hardworking City employees and the crews from both Crowder Gulf and WastePro, for their long hours, working to restore Palm Coast to its beautiful pre-hurricane condition. And we thank our residents for their patience during this long process.

Palm Coast Tree Lighting on Dec. 1 kicks off series of fun holiday events

Palm Coast – Kick off the holiday season at the City of Palm Coast's annual Tree Lighting Ceremony at 6 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 1, at Central Park in Town Center, 975 Central Ave., Palm Coast. The event is free.

Join Santa Claus, Palm Coast Mayor Milissa Holland and the Rotary Club of Flagler County in the countdown to the lighting of a beautiful tree, being decorated this year with sparkling lights and ornaments made by Girl Scouts from local troops. Carol Mini, the City's Urban Forester, hand-selected the tree from Santa's Christmas Tree Forest in Eustis. The Sand Pine (Pinus clausa) is 25 feet tall with a 25- to 30-foot spread. The tree has been pruned into a Christmas tree shape for many years to prepare it as a City holiday tree.

After the tree lighting, Santa will visit with children, and everyone can enjoy entertainment and refreshments, and take a walk through the Fantasy Lights! Parents should bring their own cameras to capture pictures of their children visiting Santa in the Santa's Village area. Children can also write Letters to Santa.

The Rotary Club of Flagler County's 11th Annual Fantasy Lights Festival at Central Park will open that same night – continuing 6:30-9 p.m. daily through Dec. 30. On opening night, Dec. 1, Rotary will also be offering its "A Taste of the Holidays" progressive dinner alongside the Fantasy Lights displays, with tickets available at the event.

Admission to Fantasy Lights is free, but donations to support Rotary's service work are accepted. Fantasy Lights is a self-guided walking tour around Central Park featuring 45 animated light displays, festive live and broadcast music, Santa's Village, and holiday refreshments available for purchase. There will be photos with Santa and Mrs. Claus, Santa's Merry Train Ride, 3-D twinkle glasses and snow! City of Palm Coast Citizens Academy graduates 38th class

Palm Coast – Twenty-three Palm Coast residents graduated this month from the Palm Coast Citizens Academy, a comprehensive program designed to educate interested residents about the operation and workings of their City government.

The graduating class – the 38th in the program's history – spent five weeks learning about City departments and visiting City Hall, main Fire Station 25, and Water Treatment Plant No. 3. The class also attended a Palm Coast City Council meeting together; it was the Nov. 15 meeting when Mayor Milissa Holland and Council Members Robert Cuff and Nick Klufas were sworn in.

Former Palm Coast Mayor Jon Netts, who was still in office when the program begin, kicked off the Citizens Academy with an overview session titled, "Governing the City," providing background on Palm Coast's incorporation, City Charter, the Council-Manager form of government, and a general overview of the City. City Manager Jim Landon and Director of Administrative Services and Economic Development Beau Falgout provided an update on economic development trends, current projects and the mission of the Palm Coast Business Assistance Center. Those enrolled in the Citizens Academy received an overview on every City department and met City Council members, department directors and many other City employees.

The Citizens Academy meets once a week, usually on Monday evenings, for five straight weeks. The course is free and registration is limited to approximately 30 Palm Coast citizens per session. The academy is held three times a year – fall, winter and spring.
