Re: Week in Review

In the past week, the department responded to a total of 166 calls. There were 0 fire calls. A total of 104 EMS calls were logged and the balance was miscellaneous in nature. The drought index is at 215 out of a possible 800 and the fire danger is high.

Governor Rick Scott has declared a State of Emergency in Florida on Tuesday, following the recent wildfires across the State and the high potential for increased wildfires to continue throughout the coming months. We are experiencing unusually dry weather. As the drought index continues to climb, there is a higher risk for wildfires.

The Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers Course provides healthcare professionals the ability to recognize several life-threatening emergencies, administer CPR, use an AED, and relieve choking in a safe, effective and timely manner.

Re: Week in Review

- The average water demand for this week was 8.046 million gallons per day. The average wastewater flow was 6.402 million gallons per day.
- Crews installed 5 new domestic water meters, 1 reuse meter, 6 new PEP tanks and replaced 1 PEP tank.
- There were a total of 37 calls after hours.
- There were 98 disconnects for non-payment this week.
- This week crews worked at Holland Park installing a split casing and with a spray foam liner for CME to protect a pipe that was going to be encased in a footer.
- On Tuesday, a broken flushing hydrant on Eastbury Place was replaced with an in-ground flushing system and the existing meter pit on the lot line was retrofitted to the current Utility standard with backflow prevention. This affected 2 houses for 3 hours.





- Wastewater crews completed 54 pep maintenance and 90 service orders. Installed 5 new pep pumps and 8 electric assemblies. Replaced 19 pep pumps, 14 floats, and 7 cleanout caps. Replaced 7 ball valves, 7 valve boxes, 1 back lid, 1 pep chamber, and 1 pep panel.
- Wastewater crews inspected via CCTV 6,499 feet of gravity sewer and inspected 33 manholes.
- Water Distribution crews repaired 3 service lines, 2 meter pits, and tested/repaired 85 backflow preventers.
- Compliance/Environmental staff set up the Water Conservation and Stormwater display table, panels and brochures for the Annual Palm Coast Plant Clubs Plant Sale at Town Center on Saturday.

City of Palm Coast, SJRWMD invite public to ribbon-cutting for BS-2 weir

Palm Coast – Have you always wanted a close-up look and better understanding of the City of Palm Coast's water control structures?

On Tuesday, April 18, the City and the St. Johns River Water Management District will celebrate the reconstruction of the BS-2 Water Control Structure at 107 Barrington Drive, Palm Coast. The ribbon-cutting ceremony will begin at 1 p.m. (Parking is limited, so guests are encouraged to carpool with friends and neighbors.)

The public is invited to come out and see a demonstration of the operation of the water control structure (also known as a weir) and how the City maintains its extensive network of canals. Palm Coast's stormwater drainage system is made up of swales, ditches and canals – an effective and environmentally friendly drainage system.

The April 18 program will also be an opportunity to learn more about the City's partnership with the Water Management District, which funded the BS-2 Water Control Structure reconstruction. Palm Coast Mayor Milissa Holland and St. Johns River Water Management District Executive Director Dr. Ann Shortelle will be the speakers at the ceremony. City of Palm Coast Stormwater Manager Mike Brennan will lead the demonstration of the BS-2 weir.

"This project is a great example of regional and local government cooperation," Shortelle said. "The District is pleased to assist the City with this flood control project, protecting people and property, as well as providing environmental benefits."

The BS-2 weir is located on the Barrister Waterway and was originally built by ITT Corp. in the 1970s. Oral history indicates that at some point, the BS-2 structure was used as temporary vehicular access to the northern part of Palm Coast, before the road network existed. It was built at a higher elevation than originally planned, and extensive road flooding has been an ongoing problem in the adjacent upstream neighborhoods. The reconstruction completed recently replaced the structure with a design that more closely matches the original design intent and is expected to alleviate that roadway flooding.
