	About the Trip: Break out your long lens and join wildlife photographer and Birds of a Feather Fest founder Jason Giraulo for an intensive photo workshop. 	About the Park: More than 220 bird species, 63 butterfly species, reptiles and mammals call Orlando Wetlands Park their home. Wading birds like Snowy Egret, Great Blue Heron, Green Heron, White Egret, White lbis, Glossy lbis are common here year around. Purple Gallinule as well as Common Gallinule, Limpkins, Least Bittern and American Bittern can also be found throughout the park. Raptors like Red-shouldered Hawks, Ospreys, Barred Owls and Bald Eagles hunt and nest within the park. Occasionally Crested Caracara, Short-tailed Hawk, and Snail Kites are seen. Flocks of 1000's of Tree Swallows migrating in late fail and early spring can be found feeding and roosting in the Wetlands. Other rarities like Vermilion Flycatcher, Groove-billed Ani, White-faced Ibis have been spotted at this wonderful place.
