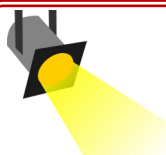

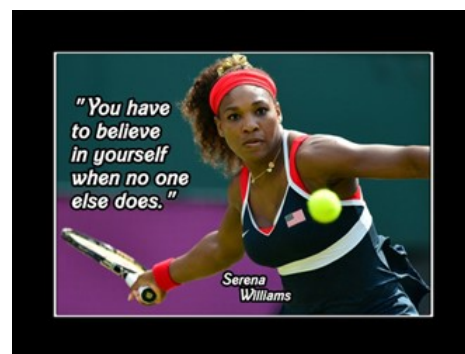
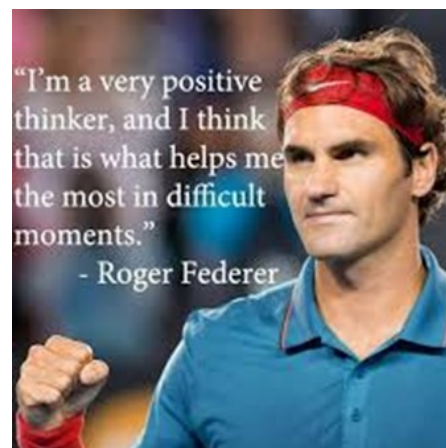

FUN FACTS

Tennis was initially played with your hands. It was called “jeu de paume” (game of the palm). People’s hands were presumably worn and red until the 16th century when racquets came into use!

The first women to play in the Wimbledon tournament wore full length dresses.

In the beginning, tennis courts were hourglass shaped. Rectangular courts have been in existence since 1875.
