PASSHOLDER SPOTLIGHT Scott Wehr & FCTL

My first 55 years were spent in the Upper Perkiomen Valley, in rural southeast Pennsylvania. Football, baseball, basketball and track were the only interscholastic sports available for boys at the time. I played football and baseball in high school but only baseball at the college level. After graduating from Kutztown State College, I was offered a teaching position in the Upper Perkiomen School District, so I joined many of my former teachers in the Middle School, and was also welcomed by my high school football and baseball coaches to join their staff.



After a 33 year career, I retired from teaching in June of 2003. My wife, Paula, retired from Merck in September of 2003. Two months later we were living in Florida. No more northern winters for us! Since retiring from teaching, I have a lot more time to read. Now to the reason why I'm in the spotlight this month. As the current Commissioner of the FCTL, I was asked to provide some background information about both myself and the league. The FCTL got its start following the demise of the men's 4.0 GVTL day league. A team without a league, we continued playing social matches along with a group of real strong 3.5+ players. After one of our outings we semi-seriously kicked around the idea of picking teams to create an informal league. When we met to play the following week, Bill Luther informed us that he had spoken to management and gotten them to agree to give us six courts if we would play at 11am. Things got much more formal immediately and the league took off with four 10-man teams in September of 2010. As players dropped out, got hurt, or moved out of the area, we found ourselves struggling to fill the rosters. In 2013, we asked Ann Harple, Jeannine Garnett, Gail Neufeld and Doreen Davis if they would be interested in joining the league. Fortunately for us they said yes, because they paved the way for the 18 ladies who were included in this year's draft. The league has gotten stronger and more competitive from top to bottom with the addition of new men and ladies over the past five years. Tennis has been a great way for Paula and I to stay active and meet many wonderful people from all walks of life.
